Population of Focus:

Students grades 7th -12th in the two school districts within Adams County to reduce underage drinking.

Statement of the Community's Readiness to Address the Problem of Practice:

We conducted interviews with eight key local leaders during our community readiness assessment and in scoring our interviews determined we are in the stage of "Vague Awareness". Members of our Prevention Data Committee participated in the readiness assessment interviews and scoring. The PDC plays an important role in addressing underage drinking.

Theory of Community Change:

If we implement an effective Talk, They Hear You Campaign, then we can expect to increase the parental knowledge and skills needed to discuss underage drinking along with increasing the parental disapproval of underage drinking.

If we increase parental knowledge and skills needed to discuss underage drinking along with increasing parental disapproval of underage drinking, then we can expect the youth to report an increase in family communication regarding the dangers of tobacco, alcohol and drug use as evidenced in the OHYES! survey results.

If there is an increase in family communication regarding the dangers of tobacco, alcohol or drug use, then we can expect a reduction in underage drinking as evidenced by youth who report consuming alcohol in the past 30 days as evidenced in the OHYES! Survey results.

We had a huge jump from 10.6% in 8 th grade to 32% in 12 th grade, which is a 33% increase.	Data to Support the Intervening Variable: The 2017 OHYES!
